I have been blessed to work with the best board members, volunteers, coordinators, churches, generous contributors, program assistants, and the businesses and organizations Interfaith has partnered with.

It was approved by the Board of Director's, at its September 2016 meeting, that I would step down as Program Director in July 2017 and move to the Program Assistant position for about six months. My plan is to leave slowly as Interfaith means so much to me.

Lori Chown, will become Program Director at that time. How exciting for the community to have Lori at the helm with her skills and her passion for helping people. If you haven't met Lori yet, please stop by our office. She loves meeting new people.

In our 27 years, board members and

staff have strived to meet community needs. New programs have been developed such as New Mother's Helper, Bear Essentials, JUMP-our school based mentoring program, and our Library & Groceries to Go Programs. These programs wouldn't be possible without our dedicated volunteers.

The number of people we help each month continues to grow, reaffirming that we are only as strong as our volunteer base. If you can give one hour a week, or an hour each month, we will find a volunteer opportunity for you.

While we have made great progress with helping people and developing programs, our work is not done. There are still so many needs to be considered that may fit well with our Christian outreach program.
