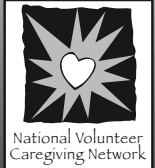

- Slides show of past tournaments

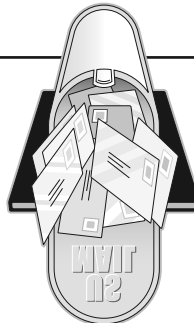
